They will compete in Class B for Special Vehicles with two-litre, four-cylinder engines.

Their combat transportation will be an all-new ProMotorSport ORCO, to make its racing debut in this weekend's Nissan Dealer 400 race through the Western Cape.

FOLLOWING 16 months of testing and development, the new ProMotorSport ORCO of Gerhard and Zelda Niemandt will make its local Off Road racing debut in the Western Cape this weekend.

Generation

The car represents the latest generation of racer from the local Bosss Industries Company. Bosss Industries has designed many race-winning ORCO chassis over the years. ORCO cars have been successful in both Class A - for unlimited Special Vehicles - and Class B in recent times.

In the latter category, Bosss Industries supplied the single-seater Truggy that Giel Nel used to win the 2003 national Class B title.

The ProMotorSport ORCO has been developed and tested over the last 16 months, and is expected to be competitive from the word go.

"Our main aim this weekend will be finish the race."

"To that end, the car has been painstakingly prepared, with much attention to detail."

"However, it has proven extremely quick during testing, which adds to our enthusiasm for the car's debut performance," said Zelda this week.

Supporting the ProMotorSport team this weekend will be Jakes from Remax Traders in Kempton Park and the Sentry Remotes company. Meanwhile, Aranoil will supply the team's lubricants.
